Welcome to Cathedral Isle of Man

If you need a **large-print** hymn book or music edition please ask the welcomers.

Communion. If you are a practising Christian of any denomination, and normally receive Communion in your home church, you are welcome to receive at the Lord's Altar.

Distribution of Communion: Congregants are advised to receive the host first from the President and then move to receive the chalice. The Welcomers will bring people up section by section and if you wish to stay seated in your place, we will come to you at the end of communion. If you do not wish to receive you are welcome to come for a blessing – indicating by holding your service book.

If you require a **gluten-free wafer**, or would like to receive communion seated, do let one of the stewards know. Because of cross contamination (for someone who is gluten free) we have taken the decision to ask that you **refrain from Intinction** (dipping) of the host into the chalice.

Refreshments will be served today after the service.

1 Kings 19: 4 – 8.

⁴ But he himself went a day's journey into the wilderness, and came and sat down under a solitary broom tree. He asked that he might die: 'It is enough; now, O LORD, take away my life, for I am no better than my ancestors.'⁵ Then he lay down under the broom tree and fell asleep. Suddenly an angel touched him and said to him, 'Get up and eat.'⁶ He looked, and there at his head was a cake baked on hot stones, and a jar of water. He ate and drank, and lay down again.⁷ The angel of the LORD came a second time, touched him, and said, 'Get up and eat, otherwise the journey will be too much for you.'⁸ He got up, and ate and drank; then he went in the strength of that food for forty days and forty nights to Horeb the mount of God.

The Triskelion Way

From Fri 30 Aug to Mon 2 Sept. The Triskelion Way Pilgrimage.

The Pilgrimage is a trail running 37 miles (60km) across the Isle of Man through stunning coast and hill scenery, linking the historic centers of Rushen Abbey, St German's Cathedral and Maughold. Join us for any or all of a 4-day walk along the entire route - a chance to take time out for reflection, poetry, prayer, and silence. Ancient heritage will be visited along the way; keills (early chapels), carved crosses and holy wells. The terrain varies from sheltered glen to rugged moorland, from high clifftops to dramatic waterfall.

The Cathedral Car park is now once again available for vehicles. The flower tubs alongside the pavement are spaced at car parking intervals, so drive between them. (They are slightly more generous than traditional car parking). The Flower tubs are to remind people not to allow their vehicles to overhang the pavement, which then prevents people with mobility issues accessing the Corrin Hall or Cathedral.
