# **Welcome to Cathedral** Isle of Man

If you need a large-print hymn book or music edition please ask the welcomers.

Communion. If you are a practicing Christian of any denomination, and normally receive Communion in your home church, you are welcome to receive at the Lord's Altar.

**Distribution of Communion**: Congregants are advised to receive the host first from the President and then move to receive the chalice. The Welcomers will bring people up section by section and if you wish to stay seated in your place, we will come to you at the end of communion. If you do not wish to receive you are welcome to come for a blessing - indicating by holding your service book.

If you require a gluten-free wafer, or would like to receive communion seated, do let one of the stewards know. Because of cross contamination (for someone who is gluten free) we have taken the decision to ask that you refrain from Intinction (dipping) of the host into the chalice.

Refreshments will be served today after the service.

# **Post Communion**

God our Father, whose Son Jesus Christ gives the water of eternal life: may we thirst for you, the spring of life and source of goodness, through him who is alive and reigns, now and for ever. **Amen** 

## Acts 16: 9 - 15.

During the night Paul had a vision: there stood a man of Macedonia pleading with him and saying, 'Come over to Macedonia and help us.' When he had seen the vision, we immediately tried to cross over to Macedonia, being convinced that God had called us to proclaim the good news to them.

We set sail from Troas and took a straight course to Samothrace, the following day to Neapolis, and from there to Philippi, which is a leading city of the district of Macedonia and a Roman colony. We remained in this city for some days. On the sabbath day we went outside the gate by the river, where we supposed there was a place of prayer; and we sat down and spoke to the women who had gathered there. A certain woman named Lydia, a worshipper of God, was listening to us;

she was from the city of Thyatira and a dealer in purple cloth. The Lord opened her heart to listen eagerly to what was said by Paul. When she and her household were baptized, she urged us, saying, 'If you have judged me to be faithful to the Lord, come and stay at my home.' And she prevailed upon us.

# John 14: 23 - 29.

Jesus answered him, 'Those who love me will keep my word, and my Father will love them, and we will come to them and make our home with them. Whoever does not love me does not keep my words; and the word that you hear is not mine, but is from the Father who sent me.

'I have said these things to you while I am still with you. But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything, and remind you of all that I have said to you. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid. You heard me say to you, "I am going away, and I am coming to you." If you loved me, you would rejoice that I am going to the Father, because the Father is greater than I. And now I have told you this before it occurs, so that when it does occur, you may believe.

## **Bishops of Man and the Isles**

The Names on the Cathedral Floor Mark of Galloway A.D. 1275. A Galloway man, on the nomination of Alexander, King of Scotland, consecrated by John, Archbishop of Drontheim. He was driven out by the Manxmen, for which the Island was placed under an interdict for three years; and being recalled, he laid a "smoke penny" upon every house with a fireplace, by way of commutation, which continues to this day. He held a synod at Braddan Church, March 10, 1291, in which thirty-five canons were enacted 23 He died in 1303, at a good old age, when he had become blind, and was buried in St. German's Cathedral, in Peel Castle, without any memorial. His signature is to a letter to King Edward, A.D. 1289. Oliver's Monumenta, ii. p. 106; also at p. 133 of the same. Dated "A.D. 1299, and 23d of our consecration."
