## Welcome to Cathedral Isle of Man

If you need a **large-print** hymn book or music edition, they are available at the back of the Cathedral.

**Communion.** If you are a practising Christian of any denomination, and normally receive Communion in your home church, **you are welcome to receive at the Lord's Altar.** If you do not wish to receive you are welcome to come for a blessing – indicating by holding your service book

If you require a **gluten-free wafer**, or would like to receive communion seated, do let one of the stewards know.

Because of cross contamination (for someone who is gluten free) we have taken the decision to please ask that you **refrain from Intinction** (dipping) of the host into the chalice.

**Prayer** Two people will be available in the south transept to pray with anyone who would like private prayer for themselves or friends after the service.

**Refreshments** will be served today after the service.

## A reading from the Gospel of John 6: 51-58

I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh.'

The Jews then disputed among themselves, saying, 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?' So Jesus said

to them, 'Very truly, I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood have eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day; for my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink. Those who eat my flesh and drink my blood abide in me, and I in them. Just as the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so whoever eats me will live because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven, not like that which your ancestors ate, and they died. But the one who eats this bread will live for ever.

You will often see the Cathedral decorated and the clergy dressed in different Liturgical Colours the reason for which may not always be clear. At its simplest;

White is the colour for Celebrations such as Christmas, Easter etc. We are white this Sunday as we are keeping Corpus Christi – or the day of thanksgiving for, or celebration of, the institution of Holy Communion.

Red is mainly used in Holy week, Pentecost and to celebrate the feast days of Saints who were martyrs

Purple is used in what we refer to as penitential seasons – so mainly Lent and Advent when we are invited to spend time reflecting on what Jesus has done for us in his suffering on the Cross and in preparation to celebrate his incarnation.

Green is used when none of the other colours would be appropriate. This is often referred to as ordinary time.
