Welcome to Cathedral Isle of Man in the Corrin Hall

If you need a **large-print** hymn book or music edition please ask the welcomers.

Communion. If you are a practising Christian of any denomination, and normally receive Communion in your home church, you are welcome to receive at the Lord's Altar.

Distribution of Communion: Congregants are advised to receive the host first from the President and then move to receive the chalice. The Welcomers will bring people up section by section and if you wish to stay seated in your place, we will come to you at the end of communion. If you do not wish to receive you are welcome to come for a blessing – indicating by holding your service book.

If you require a **gluten-free wafer**, or would like to receive communion seated, do let one of the stewards know. Because of cross contamination (for someone who is gluten free) we have taken the decision to ask that you **refrain from Intinction** (dipping) of the host into the chalice.

Refreshments will be served today after the service.

The **Toilet** facilities are at the left hand side of the Corrin Hall stage and aside the Song School as indicated.

Most merciful God, who by the death and resurrection of your Son Jesus Christ delivered and saved the world: grant that by faith in him who suffered on the cross we may triumph in the power of his victory; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. **Amen.**

Post Communion

Lord Jesus Christ, you have taught us that what we do for the least of our brothers and sisters we do also for you: give us the will to be the servant of others as you were the servant of all, and gave up your life and died for us, but are alive and reign, now and forever. **Amen.**

A reading from Jeremiah 31: 31-34

The days are surely coming, says the LORD, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt—a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, says the LORD. But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the LORD: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, 'Know the LORD', for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the LORD; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more.

A reading from the Gospel of John 12 : 20-33

Now among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and said to him, 'Sir, we wish to see Jesus.' Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. Jesus answered them, 'The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will honour.

'Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say—"Father, save me from this hour"? No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name.' Then a voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.' The crowd standing there heard it and said that it was thunder. Others said, 'An angel has spoken to him.' Jesus answered, 'This voice has come for your sake, not for mine. Now is the judgement of this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself.' He said this to indicate the kind of death he was to die.

Stop the War on Gaza

Tuesday 19th March 12-2.00pm

Outside Tynwald Buildings.

We are calling on Tynwald or the Chief Minister to issue a statement condemning the horrors that have been unleashed on Palestinian civilians by the Israeli government and the Israeli Defence Force (IDF) and to support the calls for an immediate ceasefire.

Following the International Court of Justice (ICJ) ruling that the IDF offensive is potentially in breach of the Genocide Convention, the ICJ is now investigating accusations that the UK and four other countries are also complicit in these war crimes. By continuing to remain silent the Isle of Man is also complicit by default. After several months of lobbying MHKs and contacting the Chief Minister directly there has still been no public statement regarding Tynwald's position on what has been universally condemned as the collective punishment of a whole population and is potentially genocide.

All we have been asking for is that the Chief Minister releases a statement supporting the call for an immediate ceasefire and to respect the ruling of the ICJ for steps to be taken to prevent a genocide. The UK is beginning to look increasingly alone on the world stage as it doggedly sticks by Israel and continues arms sales, despite overwhelming international condemnation and a statement on behalf of the Isle of Man would at least distance us from the allegations of collective complicity in crimes against humanity that the UK is now facing.

It's going to be difficult for many to attend on a weekday lunchtime but PLEASE if you can try and join us - even it's just for a short period of time. We need as many people as possible - especially between 12 and 1 when photographs are scheduled.

God of our treasured past, our living present, and our future hope, we give thanks that through your Son Jesus Christ we have been made part of your new community. Hear us as we pray for the person you are calling to be the next Bishop of Sodor and Man; give discernment to all involved in the process; that the one whom we receive may shepherd your flock, teach the faith, proclaim the good news, and lead us in making Christ visible. By the power of the Holy Spirit, pour out on us the riches of your grace, that we may joyfully share in the work of your Kingdom in this Isle. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.
