Welcome to Cathedral Isle of Man in the Corrin Hall

If you need a **large-print** hymn book or music edition please ask the welcomers.

Communion. If you are a practising Christian of any denomination, and normally receive Communion in your home church, you are welcome to receive at the Lord's Altar.

Distribution of Communion: Congregants are advised to receive the host first from the President and then move to receive the chalice. The Welcomers will bring people up section by section and if you wish to stay seated in your place, we will come to you at the end of communion. If you do not wish to receive you are welcome to come for a blessing – indicating by holding your service book.

If you require a **gluten-free wafer**, or would like to receive communion seated, do let one of the stewards know. Because of cross contamination (for someone who is gluten free) we have taken the decision to ask that you **refrain from Intinction** (dipping) of the host into the chalice.

Refreshments will be served today after the service.

The **Toilet** facilities are at the left hand side of the Corrin Hall stage and aside the Song School as indicated.

A reading from the Gospel of Mark 11: 1-11

When they were approaching
Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany,
near the Mount of Olives, he sent two of
his disciples and said to them, 'Go into
the village ahead of you, and
immediately as you enter it, you will find
tied there a colt that has never been
ridden; untie it and bring it. If anyone
says to you, "Why are you doing this?"
just say this, "The Lord needs it and will
send it back here immediately." ' They
went away and found a colt tied near a
door, outside in the street. As they were
untying it, some of the bystanders said
to them, 'What are you doing, untying
the colt?' They told them what Jesus
had said; and they allowed them to take
it. Then they brought the colt to Jesus
and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat

on it. Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting, 'Hosanna!

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord!

Blessed is the coming kingdom of our ancestor David!
Hosanna in the highest heaven!

Then he entered Jerusalem and went into the temple; and when he had looked around at everything, as it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the twelve.
