A reading from the Gospel of John 12: 1-8

Six days before the Passover Jesus came to Bethany, the home of Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead. There they gave a dinner for him. Martha served, and Lazarus was one of those at the table with him. Mary took a pound of costly perfume made of pure nard, anointed Jesus' feet, and wiped them with her hair. The house was filled with the fragrance of the perfume. But Judas Iscariot, one of his disciples (the one who was about to betray him), said, 'Why was this perfume not sold for three hundred denarii and the money given to the poor?' (He said this not because he cared about the poor, but because he was a thief; he kept the common purse and used to steal what was put into it.) Jesus said, 'Leave her alone. She bought it so that she might keep it for the day of my burial. You always have the poor with you, but you do not always have me.'

There will be a screening of the BBC production of The Passion on Monday 11th April at Dalby Schoolrooms 6.30pm – 10.15pm (including a 15 min interval) Everyone’s very welcome. No need to book. Refreshments will be available throughout the evening.

This is a television drama serial produced by the BBC and HBO Films in association with Deep Indigo Productions. It tells the story of the last week in the life of Jesus. Writer Frank Deasy and producer Nigel Stafford-Clark were inspired to make a drama that opened up the story beyond the "vacuum" it is often told in. They did this by exploring the politics of Judea at the time and expanding the roles of Pontius Pilate and Caiaphas, aided by scholar Mark Goodacre. It was directed by Michael Offer on location in Morocco and broadcast on BBC One in four parts. Its viewing figures ranged from 3.2 million to 4.9 million people, and it received generally positive critical reception.
