Distribution of Communion:

The Welcomers will bring people up section by section and if you wish to stay seated in your place, we will come to you at the end of communion. If you do not wish to receive you are welcome to come for a blessing – indicating by holding your service book.

If you require a **gluten-free wafer**, or would like to receive communion seated, do let one of the stewards know. Because of cross contamination (for someone who is gluten free) we have taken the decision to ask that you **refrain from Intinction** (dipping) of the host into the chalice.

Some Quotes re the current situation in Gaza.

The Archbishop of York, together with the Bishops of Southwark, Gloucester, Chelmsford and Norwich (speaking on behalf of the Church of England):

... We call upon the Israeli Government to commit to an immediate ceasefire and to desist from actions that are leading to starvation in Gaza as well as from policies leading to the progressive annexation of the West Bank. ...

the prospect of the United Kingdom recognising Palestinian statehood is welcome, overdue, and cannot come soon enough. As settlement expansion continues in the West Bank, the UK must recognise Palestine while there is still land on which a state could be recognised. ...

... May God bring an end to these terrible injustices and guide our feet into the way of peace.

the Anglican Archbishop of Jerusalem and the Middle East, the Most Revd Hosam Naoum, described the food situation in Gaza when addressing the General Synod of the Church of England:

'with three sites open for one hour a day for 2 million people it looks for me like the Hunger Games'.
