Welcome to Cathedral Isle of Man

If you need a large-print hymn book or music edition please ask the welcomers.

Communion. If you are a practicing Christian of any denomination, and normally receive Communion in your home church, you are welcome to receive at the Lord's Altar.

Distribution of Communion: Congregants are advised to receive the host first from the President and then move to receive the chalice. The Welcomers will bring people up section by section and if you wish to stay seated in your place, we will come to you at the end of communion. If you do not wish to receive you are welcome to come for a blessing - indicating by holding your service book.

If you require a gluten-free wafer, or would like to receive communion seated, do let one of the stewards know. Because of cross contamination (for someone who is gluten free) we have taken the decision to ask that you refrain from Intinction (dipping) of the host into the chalice.

Refreshments will be served today after the service.

Bishops of Man and the Isles

The Names on the Cathedral Floor

Bernard of Kilwinning 1329 Wrongly identified as Bernard de Linton, parson of Mordington. A.D. 1328. De Linton in Roxburghshire, a Scotch man. He died 1333, and was buried at the Abbey of Arbroath, in Scotland, where he had been abbot from 1309-1328. He was consecrated in Norway, A.D. 1329. He was held in great esteem by Robert Bruce, who often resided with him at his Abbey of Arbroath. In 1329, as Bishop of Sodor, he witnessed a charter granted by King Robert Bruce to the city of Glasgow.
