The Third Collect, for Aid against all Perils

LIGHTEN our darkness, we beseech thee, O Lord; and by thy great mercy defend us from all perils and dangers of this night; for the love of thy only Son, our Saviour, Jesus Christ. **Amen.**

The Choir will now sing an Anthem (a special piece of music appropriate for today or the church season)

On Feast days a Sermon may be preached at this point, or after the service.

On occasions other prayers may be offered at this point.

A Prayer for the Queen's Majesty.

Officiant O LORD, our heavenly Father, high and mighty, King of kings, Lord of lords, the only Ruler of princes, who dost from thy throne behold all the dwellers upon earth: Most heartily we beseech thee with thy favour to behold our most gracious Sovereign Lady, Queen *ELIZABETH*; and so replenish her with the grace of thy Holy Spirit, that she may alway incline to thy will, and walk in thy way. Endue her plenteously with heavenly gifts; grant her in health and wealth long to live; strengthen her that she may vanquish and overcome all her enemies; and finally after this life she may attain everlasting joy and felicity; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

A Prayer for the Royal Family.

Officiant ALMIGHTY God, the fountain of all goodness, we humbly beseech thee to bless *Philip* Duke of *Edinburgh*, *Charles* Prince of *Wales*, our Patron *The Princess Royal* and all the Royal Family. Endue them with thy Holy Spirit; enrich them with thy heavenly grace; prosper them with all happiness; and bring them to thine everlasting kingdom; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

A Prayer for the Clergy and People.

Officiant ALMIGHTY and everlasting God, who alone workest great marvels: Send down upon our Bishops, and Curates, and all Congregations committed to their charge, the healthful Spirit of thy grace; and that they may truly please thee, pour upon them the continual dew of thy blessing. Grant this, O Lord, for the honour of our Advocate and Mediator, Jesus Christ. **Amen.**

A Prayer of Saint Chrysostom.

Officiant ALMIGHTY God, who hast given us grace at this time with one accord to make our common supplications unto thee; and dost promise that when two or three are gathered together in thy Name thou wilt grant their requests: Fulfil now, O Lord, the desires and petitions of thy servants, as may be most expedient for them; granting us in this world knowledge of thy truth, and in the world to come life everlasting. **Amen.**

An explanation of Evensong

The Reformation in England saw Archbishop Cranmer combine and simplify the 'offices' (Prayers) said daily in monasteries. Evensong is the combination of Vespers (said at sunset) and Compline (said at the completion of the day). These offices were part of the monastic round of seven daily prayer times, which had been in place for 1300 years and prior to that drew inspiration from the early church and the Jewish Synagogue.

Cranmer's Evensong had the following components:

Psalms: drawn from the whole Psalter (The Jewish Hymn book), once there were special psalms for each office.

The Canticles: The Magnificat, associated with Vespers, which is said after the Old Testament and looks forward to the coming of Christ, linking it to the New Testament Reading and the Nunc Dimittis, associated with Compline, when the aged Simon praised God for seeing salvation at the end of his life.

Scripture: Today we use 'The pillar lectionary' which is designed to make every portion of scripture stand on its own rather than being part of an incomplete story.

The Lord's Prayer and other prayers: Versicles and responses are taken almost word for word from the old services. The first collect (was prayer of the week), the second collect, (associated with Vespers) and the third collect (associated with Compline).

Additions: After 1549 there were various revisions of Evensong, which added other elements, including a preamble and confession, additional prayers, an anthem (in Quires and places where they sing) and the Creed, statement of Christian belief. Common Worship has more recently done much to re-instate the old office of Vespers and Compline.

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
